Water/Sewer :

1. DPW has had several problems at the Wayne Ave Pump Station and Watson Ave Lift Station due to sever lines clogged by trash that was tossed down residential toilets, when those items should have been tossed into the garbage can. Items not of a biodegradable nature should <u>not</u> be flushed down the toilet. Disposable diapers also clog the pipes, as do items that float, because those items are never submerged sufficiently to reach the outflow pipes. Remember: Toilets are <u>not</u> Garbage Cans! It's very expensive to repair or replace a burned-out pump, or dig up a street to fix a clog, and this directly impacts the O & M amount (operation & maintenance) on the sewer & water bills.

2. The Broome County Office for Aging will soon be conducting a countywide survey as part of its **Age Friendly Project**, which is aimed at prioritizing the wants & needs of residents aged 55+. The survey is being drafted this month and copies will be available at the Front Desk at Village Hall. Residents are encouraged to come by, take a copy or two for their household, complete the questionnaire, and return it to the special box in the lobby or put it in the Drop Box. Results will be collected until mid April. The County will then review the findings and work collaboratively with other jurisdictions to try and find some solutions. People aged 60+ currently comprise 24.5% of the county population and by 2025, it will rise to 30+.
