### **PUBLIC COMMENT:**

**Officers Present:** 

- Town of Fenton Attorney Millus and Board Member Husar addressed the Board requesting raising/eliminating weight limit restrictions on the West Service Rd. They have concern regarding the additional bus and truck traffic through the portion of Chenango St. through Hillcrest creating safety issues in the residential area. Attorney Millus reported that there is no plan to allow NG Advantage develop the land on the W. Service Rd for a compressor station.
- Giordi DeAngelo reported that plans continue for the Fall Pumpkin Festival on 9/21/19. PD Elementary School will be available for parking. There will be food trucks, music, childrens activities and exhibits. The Village will have an additional Police Officer working that day.
- Trina Schmitts reported that parking on Grant St. remains an issue for turning onto the street and onto Summer St. due to parking in proximity to intersections. Trustee Cashman will followup with the Police Dept. She also reported that: the tree/shrub on the corner of Chenango and Grant is obscuring the street signs and is growing over the sidewalk, the property at 5 Lincoln may have several code violations, the home at 760 Chenango St has garbage in the side yard. Code Officer Broughton will followup on all potential Code violations.
- Sandra Wood requested information on the status of the water main grant application. Mayor Burke reported that the application has been submitted and the grant recipients will be notified in September.

### **Public Safety:**

The Port Dickinson Police Department responded to 109 calls for assistance, gave mutual aid 7 times, they wrote 8 traffic Tickets and 6 Parking tickets.

The Port Dickinson Fire Department responded to 14 calls for assistance 9 fire calls 5 EMS calls, 8 calls in the Village, 1 call in the Town of Dickinson, 4 calls in Fenton and 1 call in the City of Binghamton. Th Fire Department had 76 man hours of training.

### Water/Sewer - Robert Aagre, Trustee

All Village Water & Sewer systems are functioning normally. There have been no major breaks in either system during this past month and that definitely helps keep costs down.

The Binghamton-Johnson City Joint Sewer Treatment Plant continues to make news, unfortunately. Like all of the 14 municipalities using the Vestal treatment plant, the Village is concerned about future rate increases forced upon us. The current price of the rebuilding of the plant is about \$275, million plus additional interest payments of over \$125 million, bringing the total to over \$400 million. In documents submitted to the sewage plant board, sewer rates for the Village as well as other users "could rise between 50% and 90%", according to the Press & Sun Bulletin.
