YARD WASTE PICKUP IMPORTANT NOTICE:

## YARD WASTE PICKUP BEGINS **TUESDAY APRIL 7.**

Cut grass will be collected in April and May but the last day for grass collection will be Tuesday May 26.

Remaining lawn debris will continue to be collected as usual.

ALL DEBRIS MUST BE IN SOLID CONTAINERS. Max. 40lbs. Overweight containers/bundles will not be picked up. NO PLASTIC BAGS. BRANCHES MUST BE TIED IN 4 FT. LENGTHS or IN CONTAINERS. Place containers/bundles between the sidewalk and the curb after 2PM on Mondays.

We have distributed information on the benefits of leaving grass clippings on the lawn and composting. Further information is available from Broome County Cooperative Extension on Front St.

#### Village Taxes:

This year's Village Tax rate will increase aprox.1.78% and be under the NYS Tax Cap. This equates out to be approx.21 cents per thousand \$ of assessed evaluation or an estimated \$10.00 annually on a home assessed at \$50,000. We are planning several street/drainage projects along with required ADA ramp installations.

June 1-10 - Water Meter Readings Due. July 31 - Water Bill Payment Deadline.

#### October 1-10 - Water Meter Readings Due. November 30 - Water Bill Payment Deadline.

All meter reading cards can be mailed or dropped off in the Drop Box in front of Village Hall or emailed to the Clerk at pdclerk@stny.rr.com make sure you receive an email reply to insure that your reading has been received. Bills with checks can be placed in drop box. We do not accept cash in the drop box.

VILLAGE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN: Under the direction of the Broome County Department of Planning & Economic Development the Village has completed its first ever Comprehensive Plan. This plan will identify the goals, objectives, and guidance for the immediate and long range protection, enhancement, and future development of our Village. It provides guidance to the Village, County and State leaders about current issues that reflect the needs and views of our residents. THERE WILL BE A **COMMUNITY WORKSHOP SCHEDULED IN** THE FUTURE AND YOU WILL BE MAILED A NOTICE. At that time you can come and learn about the Plan and share your ideas about what you would like included in the Plan. The Plan will set forth recommendations to provide a framework for future decision making in the Village.

RATES: We have received increased charges in our billings from the BJC Joint Sewage Treatment Plant and we received notice from our main water supplier The Town of Fenton that our water cost will increase also. We are reviewing our income vs. expenses as to what our increases will be. We are working diligently to try to make the impact to our residents as slight as possible.

#### **GRANTS & FUNDING:**

The Village application to the NYS WIIA Grant for the replacement of the Chenango St. (100 year old plus) and Rochelle Road (4" undersized) water mains was not approved for 2019 funding. We will reapply this year and also seek separate funding.

FINANCIAL AUDIT COMPLETED: An independent audit of the entire financial operation of the Village has been completed. No problems were found and it's noted that our systems are all NYS Comptroller approved. We will perform this independent audit every two years.

#### POLICE DEPARMENT:

Please Call the Police IF YOU SEE OR HEAR ANY SUSPICIOUS OR UNUSUAL ACTIVITY. No call is too minor and you are not required to provide your name when reporting.

- If you see vehicles or motorcycles speeding or with loud exhaust please call the Police, they are very successful in eliminating these problems
- <u>UNLOCKED</u> Vehicles are being entered. Remember to <u>LOCK YOUR VEHICLE</u> and your home.
- <u>CLOSE YOUR GARAGE DOORS</u> when no one is at home as you are only inviting problems
- DO NOT LEAVE BICYCLES AND OTHER VALUABLE ITEMS OUTSIDE AT NIGHT.
- Door to door Solicitors are allowed from 9
   AM to sunset not on Sundays or Holidays.

   They must be registered with the Clerk.

NOTE: Evening, weekend & occasional day calls to the PD Police are received by County Emergency Services. If at these times you have a problems e.g. water or sewer or desire to talk to an officer, call 722-1255, state your problem/ request to the dispatcher and a Port Dickinson Officer will either visit you, meet you at the Police Station or phone you if you request.

LOST CATS or DOGS: If your dog or cat is missing or if you have found one, you can call the Police Dept. and report it. We will attempt to assist you and coordinate the pets return.

# **COMMON BUILDING, MAINTAINANCE & PROPERTY CODE VIOLATIONS**

- GARBAGE/ RECYCLING & LAWN DEBRIS CONTAINERS may be placed to the curb after 2PM the day prior to the day of each pickup. Containers must be removed from the curb area no later than 8PM the evening of that pickup. Please note that if you have anything more than your normal container of garbage (e.g. furniture, appliances), you must call your contractor in advance of pickup to have those items collected.
- STORAGE OF CONTAINERS: -"All garbage, recycling, debris containers shall be placed and stored behind the building out of view from the street or roadway. In no event may containers be stored in front of, in the front yard, or on the front porches of buildings. In the event any garbage can, recycling bin, or debris container or other related items cannot be stored out of view from the street or roadway, the property owner shall screen such areas of storage by opaque fencing and or plantings."
- FAILURE TO HAVE VISIBLE NUMBERS ON FRONT OF RESIDENCE AND OR STRUCTURES.
- DISCHARGING / MOWING GRASS INTO THE STREET.
- PARKING VEHICLES ON FRONT LAWN AND SIDEWALK.
- NO UNREGISTERED VEHICLES / TRAILERS ALLOWED OUTSIDE ON PROPERTY.
- PEELING and or DETERIORATING PAINT ON STRUCTURES.
- <u>CANINE WASTE:</u> you must clean up after your dog. Fines, potential seizure and impoundment of the dog can occur.
- LEASH LAW: All dogs must be on a leash while being walked.

# **BUILDING PERMITS are MANDATORY:**

The following require permits (not limited to)

New Structures/Construction/Additions, Pools, Decks, Certain Size Sheds, Hot Tubs/Spas, Fire Place / Wood Burners, and \*Handicap Ramps.

\*Virtually all Handicap Ramps per the NYS Building code do not comply and would require a variance.
The Village passed a resolution to allow these non-compliant ramps <u>only for the temporary period that they are needed, but still require a permit.</u>

CALL THE BUILDING INSPECTOR @ 771-8233 WITH ANY QUESTIONS <u>PRIOR</u>. THIS WILL ALLOW YOU TO AVOID DELAYS, LEGAL ACTION & ADDED COSTS. Please allow time for the Inspector to return your call. You can pick up permit applications at the Village Hall. If you initiate construction without a permit the permit cost increases to \$100.

As in virtually all violations the Code Enforcement Officer and Building Inspector will work with all property owners to bring all violations to a satisfactory and uncomplicated conclusion.

In addition to Code Enforcement, violations are reported by the Police and Public Works employees.

# **BLACK BEAR WARNING**

## Spring/Summer 2020

The Village of Port Dickinson like other communities has over the years experienced situations where BLACK BEARS travel into our neighborhoods.

The following information was received from the NYS Department of Conservation Wildlife Officer.

- Bears are once again wandering through our neighborhoods in search of food. <u>They will eat anything that is easily accessible</u>.
- You can discourage them by <u>taking down your bird feeders</u>. Birds do not need supplemental food in the spring and summer.
- Also clean your barbeque grills and keep them inside (garage/shed) if possible.
- Store pet foods indoors and garbage in a secure building or location.
- Clean garbage cans frequently and with ammonia products and do not burn garbage.
- DO NOT add meat scraps, bones or melon rinds to your compost pile.
- Bears will <u>eat virtually anything</u> and they follow the path of least resistance, but will shred a metal garbage can to get at anything that may appeal to them

The only way to discourage and eventually stop these bears from Entering our neighborhoods is to shut off their food supply.

We have been notified by the NY State Environmental Conservation Police that it is illegal to feed Bears either intentionally or unintentionally.

The NYSDEC Law Enforcement Officer will serve all offenders with a summons!
